Four children from year 5 have been busy raising funds for Cancer Research! They've been selling home-made bracelets and keyrings and have raised £140! Well done girls!




Year 3 Focus

A message from the NHS

The Orthoptic Department at University Hospitals of Derby and Burton have been in touch to remind parents of the importance of children having regular eye tests at an optician once a year. NHS eye tests are free for all children at any opticians.

Even if your child has apparently normal vision, they should be tested to ensure their vision is developing normally so that any potential eye problems can be identified and treated early to avoid possible lifelong visual loss.



The Importance of Punctuality

Good attendance and punctuality are vital in order to get the most out of school. Consistently being late into school soon adds up to having a negative impact on learning.



With this in mind, we would like to remind you of some of our timings and procedures for our school day which can also be found here on our website.

Morning registration starts at 8:55am. Children should be in their classroom by this time.

Your child is **late** if they are not in school by 9:00am – L Code on the register Your child is "**unauthorised late**" after 9:10am – U Code on the register.

If your child is persistently late you will be informed of the concern initially via letter. You will be given the opportunity to discuss any barriers to punctuality and the support we can offer you.

If your child receives 5 late codes in a half term then we will write to you to inform you of our concerns over your child's late arrival. If this continues, we will send another letter before setting up a meeting to discuss the situation with you and to find solutions to support you.

All lateness is recorded daily. The time of arrival and the reason for lateness, if known, will also be recorded. This information can be made available to the courts and to the Local Authority in the form of a report should a Penalty Notice or prosecution be the outcome of repeated lateness after registers have closed.

Please collect your child promptly at the end of the school day. Where late collection is persistent and/or significantly late, the school may be required to share these concerns with other agencies.

Can we remind you that you will need to collect children from any school clubs on time. If you are late your child will be put into After School Club and a you will be charged.

School Barrier

The school barrier will be lowered by 8.15am and will not be raised until 4.45pm. The only parent/carers allowed on site will have to have an appointment or have a special permit.
