


Reception Newsletter - 20.1.25

PHONICS

We will learn to recognise, say and write:

/j/ as in jug

/v/ as in van

Homework:

Please practise reading and writing the following words:

jug, jump, jam, vet, van, vat



MATHS

We will be practising composing and decomposing numbers.

We will be partitioning numbers up to 5.

By the end of the year, it is expected that children should be able to recall these by heart.

We will use the following mathematical vocabulary:

Partition, split, part, whole, set
