The idea began with a handprint Max had placed in his sketchbook during an art lesson. Each of his friends transformed that handprint into a superhero or decorated it with his favourite colours, his name and, of course, Aston Villa. The result is a vibrant, joyful mural filled with love, friendship and memories.

We were incredibly lucky to receive support from Potclays, a family-run ceramics company in Staffordshire with a global reputation. When we contacted them for advice, Becky from Potclays responded with kindness and generosity. Once she heard about Max, she offered to donate everything we needed - 80 tiles, glazes and access to their kilns - to help bring our vision to life.

The children were fully engaged in the project, knowing it was for Max. It gave them a chance to talk about him, remember special moments, and express their feelings creatively.

Now, the completed mural is a space where friends stop to reflect, point out their contributions, and share memories. It's a beautiful reminder of the bond they shared. As the mural says: **"A superhero left his handprint here"** — and their friendship will last forever.

We've teamed up with *Progressive Sports*, a specialist PE and sports provider, to deliver action-packed clubs that children are going to love. From high-energy favourites like Dodgeball to new experiences like Laser Tag, there'll be something for everyone!

There will be a sports club available every evening, Monday to Thursday, all run by our experienced Progressive Sports coach, Mr Lawmon who is also our new curriculum PE coach. These clubs will take place as part of Fulfen Club, and families can choose either:

- **Club Only** pick up your child when the sporting fun ends at 4:30
- Club + Tea stay until 6pm for a delicious light tea and social time with Mrs Waterhouse and the rest of the Fulfen Club gang

A limited number of free places in the Sports Clubs will be available for children who receive Pupil Premium funding, ensuring no child misses out on these fantastic opportunities.

Our regular Fulfen Club booking form will now include these sports club options. The form is sent out on the first Tuesday of each month for the following month, so keep an eye on your inbox to secure your child's place.

## Trim Trail Update

We're pleased to share an exciting update regarding our Trim Trail project. We have recently received additional funding from the Noel Sweeney Foundation, which will be added to the total raised so far—thank you to everyone who has supported us along the way.

We are also deeply grateful to Mrs Ricketts, who organised a "Walk for Max". The event had an incredible turnout, and the funds raised have been added to the project. As a lasting tribute, the Trim Trail will serve as a memorial to Max a space where children can play, be active, and remember a very special boy.

We have now received an initial quote for the equipment and are in the process of obtaining a second quote to ensure best value. The project is likely to be completed in two stages. Our aim is to install the equipment first, with the surfacing to follow at a later stage once further funds become available.

Once we have our final drawings, we will share them with parents and ensure the children are involved in the process too. Their input and excitement are an important part of bringing this project to life.

We will continue to keep you updated as plans progress. Thank you for your ongoing support.

# Online Safety Focus – Tips for staying safe online

During the holidays, children often spend more time online than usual. While school iPads have filters to help protect pupils, no filter is perfect. It's important that other devices at home also have parental controls set up. Here are some key things to remember before the break:

- Stay private: Never share your name, age, school, or location with people you don't know in real life. If someone asks for pictures or videos of you, say no, block them, and tell a trusted adult.
- Social media: Most platforms are for ages 13+. If you use them, set your profile to private and think carefully before posting. Once something is shared, it's hard to take back. It's also illegal to take or share sexual images of anyone under 18.
- Al tools: Be cautious when using chatbots. They don't always give accurate answers and should never be given personal information or images, as these could be misused.
- Think ahead: What you post now could be seen by others in the future, including people offering you a job.
- **Speak up**: If something online makes you feel uncomfortable or someone is unkind, tell an adult. They can help report it usually by clicking the three dots next to the post or comment.
- **Check the facts**: Some online news or videos aren't real. Always stop and think before sharing.
- Avoid scams: Never give out passwords or payment info. Ignore messages offering easy money or asking you to forward them – they're often fake or criminal.
- Watch in-game spending: Some games use loot boxes or pay-to-play features, which can lead to spending more than expected.
- **Don't compare**: People often edit their posts to make their lives look more exciting. Even photos or videos can be fake, so don't believe all you see!
